INA President's Report 2017 - 2018

A Chairde

It's been a great privilege to have been President this past year. I had big shoes to fill but there is a talented and skilled committee to support me and I am grateful for their dedication, commitment and support over the past 12 months.

I am pleased to report that many individuals and groups across Sydney and NSW have been encouraged and supported in their activities and endeavours by the INA this year.

Highlights included hosting Maggie Carty as our Music Teacher in Residence. Maggie travelled from Ireland and spent a year in Sydney teaching banjo and tunes to both individuals and groups, leading sessions and playing concerts. Our Teacher in Residence Program is a significant part of our support of music, teaching young (and not so young) people traditional music and mentoring those already playing.

Maggie has now moved to Melbourne and we are in the process of recruiting our next Music Teacher in Residence. Music lessons continue with other teachers regularly giving lessons in Devonshire Street through the week.

Other musical activities included hosting two Junior Fleadhs for children in Devonshire Street and sponsoring a Junior Fleadh at the Irish and Celtic Music Festival in Yass. The Junior Fleadhs are presented free of charge and provide an opportunity for children learning Irish music to spend half a day or so learning new tunes from teachers, playing together and connecting with other children and young people playing music rather than learning by themselves in isolation.

In August a new and popular mid-paced monthly Saturday session started for those intermediate players who want to play a bit faster than the Marrickville 'slow session' but not too fast. We also lent our support and encouragement to weekends of traditional music in St Albans, Katoomba and Crookwell.

The Dwyer Whelan Academy of Dance continued their Saturday classes in Devonshire St and we sponsored four Ceilidhs for set dancers through the year.

Irish language classes were held weekly through Scoil na Gaeilge including a Pop-up Gaeltacht in September.

We were proud to once again sponsor the Sydney trish Film Festival, which is growing from strength to strength and spreading its wings to other cities. It was great to see the range of films presented this year and that so many of the screenings were sold out.

We also supported an *Evening of Aisling*, a celebration of Irish literature, music and performance held at the State Library.

For the St Patrick's Day celebrations we organised a concert of Irish music at the Gaelic Club and also supported the St Patrick's Day celebrations at the Entertainment Quarter by taking a stall.

Our weekly e-newsletter *Irish events around Sydney* is a popular and useful resource to keep people informed and promote the events mentioned above and other Irish related cultural and music happenings and activities in the greater Sydney region and beyond. Our commitment to the Waverly Monument remains steadfast as we approach the completion of a multi-year project to repair and conserve it for future generations.

The Waverly Monument itself and the annual Easter commemoration held there will feature in the History of the INA (1915 –2015) currently being written by Richard Reid, Perry McIntyre and Jeff Kildea and due for publication in 2019.

Part of this history project has included undertaking an audit and cataloging of our archives, one of the most extensive of an Irish community organisation in Australia and we are appreciative of the work undertaken by the historians on our archives.

Thank you to you our members and supporters for your ideas, comments, suggestions and feedback over the past year. I can assure you that they are important to us.

Independent Auditor's Report to the Members of the Irish National Association of Australasia Incorporated

Scope

The special purpose financial report and committee's responsibility

The special purpose financial report comprises the balance sheet, income statement, accompanying notes to the financial statements and the statement by members of the committee for the Irish National Association of Australasia Incorporated for the year ended 30 June 2018.

The committee of the association is responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the financial report and have determined that the accounting polices used and described in Note 1 to the financial statements which form part of the financial report are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 2009 and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

The special purpose financial report has been prepared for the distribution to members for the purpose of fulfilling the committee's financial reporting requirements under the Associations Incorporation Act 2009. We disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

Audit Approach

We conducted an independent audit in order to express an opinion to the members of the association. Our audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards, in order to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. The nature of an audit is influenced by factors such as the use of professional judgement, selective testing, the inherent limitations of internal control and the availability of persuasive rather than conclusive evidence. Therefore, an audit cannot guarantee that all material misstatements have been detected.

We performed procedures to assess whether in all material respects the financial report presents fairly, in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1, so as to present a view which is consistent with our understanding of the association's financial position and of its performance as represented by the results of its operations. These policies do not require the application of all Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used and described in Note 1 are appropriate for the needs of the members.

We formed our audit opinion on the basis of these procedures which included:

- examining, on a test basis, information to provide evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial report, and
- assessing the appropriateness of the accounting policies and disclosures used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the committee.

While we considered the effectiveness of management's internal controls over financial reporting when determining the nature and extent of our procedures, our audit was not designed to provide assurance on internal controls.
